Introduction:

The Feedback Coordination Committee of Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya has the three fold task of designing, collecting and analysing feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate the overall performance of the college in an academic year. As observed the even semester students of BA & BCom courses in comparison to the odd semester students, get sufficient time to understand the college environment and their respective courses. Thus feedback forms were distributed amongst the even semester students of B.A and B.Com courses respectively. The different categories of Feedback Forms designed for the academic year 2022-23 are as follows:

- 1. Student's Feedback on Curriculum and Syllabus.
- 2. Faculty Feedback on Curricular aspects & its Transaction.
- 3. Student's Feedback on Safety Survey.
- 4. Employer's Feedback.
- 5. Alumni Feedback.

Objective of the Survey is to find out the shortfalls/Shorcomings of the institution such as:

- 1. The physical/infrastructural facilities provided to the students by the institution.
- 2. The academic environment.
- 3. The various strengths of the institution as a whole from the point of view of the students.
- 4. To rectify all the shortcomings, as far as possible, which come to light through the feedbacks.
- 5. To improve/strengthen on the positive aspects of the institution.

Population of the Survey:

The population of the study consists of even semester students of the 2nd, 4th, 6th Semester classes from both B.A and B.Com courses.

Methodology Adopted: A Feedback Form prepared exclusively for students have been made available online through the students mobile portal of the college. Students are invited to participate in the Feedback collection process using the same portal. The numbers of questions vary for each category of Feedback . They have to choose from the available multiple options. Questions are typed in both English and Assamese languages. The feedback form is available in both PC and mobile compatible mode. The responses of the students are tabled and evaluated in the digital form and the outcome of the study is formally handed over to the IQAC in a report format to further place before the college authority and to make it available in the Website of the college thereafter.

Mode of Survey conducted: Online (open to all UG students)


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Results of the Analysis of Data from Students' Feedback on curriculum and syllabus

A total of 337 students have responded to the feedback process through mode. The various statistics evolved out of the survey can be analysed as follows:


1. Do you think the syllabus is appropriate for the programme and includes up to date knowledge, concept, and vocational skills?


2. What Extent of the syllabus is covered in the class?


3. Whether students get opportunities to participate in students' exchange, field visit?


4. Does the curriculum sufficiently motivate students for further study and research?


5. Does the curriculum introduce students to issues such as gender equality, environment and sustainability, ethics and other values?

Summary of the analysis of the Students' Feedback on Curriculum for the session 2022-23

- 1 Majority of the students are happy with Curriculum and syllabi of the courses. They find the syllabus appropriate for the programme with up to date knowledge and concepts including vocational skills. Only 2.47% of the students do not think so.
- 2 During the Pandemic, students got relatively less time in a semester to complete the syllabi, but this session student's response regarding the extent of syllabus covered in class is very good.
- 3 26.41% of the students feel they do not get opportunities to participate in students' exchange and field visit.
- 4 Majority of the students find that the curriculum sufficiently motivates them for further study and research.
- 5 93.48% feels the curriculum introduces students to issues such as gender equality, environment and sustainability, ethics and other values. 6.52% of the students do not agree.

80 % of the students feel the academic flexibility of the curriculum promotes internships, field trips and the time and credits allotted to projects and field trips is sufficient. Approximately 20 % students do not agree.
